## Executive Summary and Key Findings

The results of the 2010 administration of the Youth Risk Behavior Survey in the City of Waynesboro are presented in the following report. In January 2010, the survey was given to those Waynesboro City students who did not opt out. A total of 557 surveys were completed: 220 from Kate Collins Middle School $7^{\text {th }}$ graders, and 337 from Waynesboro High School (170 $9^{\text {th }}$ graders and $16711^{\text {th }}$ graders). One of the high school students attends the Genesis program.

The results show the differences among students in grades 7, 9 and 11 for this year's administration; for select items, results from the previous administration are presented as well. The reader is cautioned to interpret all data carefully; the quality of self-report data is compromised by differences in student effort, perseverance, reading ability, memory and compliance.

Some key findings from this survey include:

- The percentage of students not having enough to eat continues to decrease since 2006, but is leveling off somewhat with about $15 \%$ of respondents continuing to having this concern.
- About 70\% of students have seen a dentist in the past year.
- Chewing tobacco use is relatively low: only about 5\% of this recent sample report using in the past 30 days, as compared to $35 \%$ reporting cigarette use in the same time period.
- About $28 \%$ of $7^{\text {th }}$ and $9^{\text {th }}$ graders, and $42 \%$ of $11^{\text {th }}$ graders report smoking on a daily basis.
- The perceived ease of securing cigarettes, alcohol and street drugs increases with grade level, which is consistent with 2008 findings.
- Reports of binge drinking in the past month double from $7^{\text {th }}$ to $9^{\text {th }}$ grade ( $16 \%$ to $34 \%$ ).
- As students age, friends and peers exert more influence which is consistent with previous findings. Family influence was the same across grade levels.
- For risk-perception questions, students endorse the belief that there is less risk associated with marijuana use as student age increases. Overall students believe cigarette smoking to be riskier than using either alcohol or marijuana.
- For parental approval questions, as age of student increases, perception that parents would think behavior (smoking, alcohol use, marijuana use) is "very wrong" decreases. For all three substances, a low percentage of respondents indicated that their parents would regard their children's usage as "Not at all wrong."
- Students in middle school report wearing helmets more than high school students. By activity, riders of motorcycles use helmets more often than riders of bicycles or skateboards. (Helmets for motorcyclists is a state law.)
- Seat belt use is highest for $7^{\text {th }}$ graders, and there is a noticeable increase from past surveys of the proportion of $7^{\text {th }}$ and $9^{\text {th }}$ graders who "always" wear their seat belts.
- About 5\% of students reported missing a day of school in the preceding month due to feeling unsafe; in $200825 \%$ of $7^{\text {th }}$ grade students reported missing at least a day for that reason.
- On school grounds, about $22 \%$ of students have experienced vandalism of their personal property in the past year.
- The proportion of $9^{\text {th }}$ graders indicating they have seriously considered committing suicide is much higher than for the other grades ( $20 \%$, vs. 11-12\%). This group also reports the highest suicide attempt rate.
- More $7^{\text {th }}$ graders than $11^{\text {th }}$ graders ( $58 \%$ vs. $27 \%$ ) report never using birth control. Nearly half of $11^{\text {th }}$ graders use birth control every time, compared to less than a third of $7^{\text {th }}$ graders. 9th grade behavior is closer to that of the $7^{\text {th }}$ graders.
- Over half of $11^{\text {th }}$ grade respondents report using a cell phone for 5 or more hours per day.


## Methodology

Throughout fall 2009, a core workgroup began developing the survey to be used for this recent administration. Group members decided to use a single form of the survey, not separate middle-school and high-school versions as before. Once the questions were revised to accommodate all student grade levels being evaluated, it was determined that little if any wording should be adjusted from this administration to future administrations, in order to facilitate interpretation of change over time information.

The final version of the survey had 83 questions; however, as described in further detail below, some students did not have to answer every survey item.

In December 2009, letters regarding the Youth Risk Behavior Survey were sent home with Waynesboro city school $7^{\text {th }}, 9^{\text {th }}$ and $11^{\text {th }}$ grade students. Parents who did not wish to have their children participate in the survey were requested to return opt-out forms before the winter break. Survey administration took place at both schools (Kate Collins Middle School and Waynesboro High School) January 25-28th, 2010.

Volunteers to administer the survey at KCMS and WHS were solicited at a Regional Partners in Prevention Services meeting; administration of the survey was coordinated by the Director of Student Services at Waynesboro City Schools as well as by the Office on Youth.

For the first time, surveys were administered on computer using Qualtrics ${ }^{\circledR}$. The transition from paper surveys to electronic eliminated several sources of error such as missed responses (answers were required on each survey item in order for the respondent to progress through the instrument), scanning errors, and potential for lost answer sheets. Another benefit offered by utilizing an electronic survey was that questions could be eliminated from a respondent's survey based on his/her previous answers. For example, if a student answered that he/she had never smoked a cigarette, none of the questions which would normally follow regarding numbers of cigarettes smoked, age at first use, etc., were administered.

Prior to creating tables and interpreting data, the dataset was cleaned in an effort to reduce error and to foster comparisons with greater validity. For the items asking about which grade the student was in, there were answer options for $6^{\text {th }}, 8^{\text {th }}, 10^{\text {th }}$ and $12^{\text {th }}$ grades. None of the students in the sample should have been in any grades except $7^{\text {th }}, 9^{\text {th }}$ and $11^{\text {th }}$. Taking into consideration the reported age, 22 respondents were recoded into $11^{\text {th }}$ grade, 3 were recoded into $7^{\text {th }}$ grade, and 1 was recoded into $9^{\text {th }}$ grade. While this involved subjective judgment, prone to error, it eliminates the presence of out-ofcategory data throughout the report.

Final sample sizes for the middle-school and high-school groups, respectively, were $N=220$ (Collins) and $N=337$ (Waynesboro HS; $1709^{\text {th }}$ graders and $16711^{\text {th }}$ graders). One of the $9^{\text {th }}$ graders included in the total is also a student at Genesis Alternative school and completed his/her survey in that setting.

Student confidentiality and anonymity were maintained at all times throughout the administration of the YRBS.

## How to read this report

The results are presented in groupings of similar items. Each grouping is preceded by a descriptive title. The number to the left of the question is an indication of its order on the survey instrument.

Items marked with an asterisk ( ${ }^{*}$ ) to the left of the item number were branched from a previous questions based on responses. For example, if a student indicated in item 20 that he/she had been in a physical fight in the past 12 months, then he/she would be presented with additional questions about the nature of the fight(s). The students who were not in fights would be skipped to other questions not pertaining to fights.

For survey items that were not presented to all students because of the branching design, the numbers of students endorsing each response is provided in the corresponding table. However, depending on the nature of the question, the percentages in the column to the right of these frequencies may convey information in relation to the entire grade level, instead of just for that question's respondents. The tables are clearly marked with information about what the percentages reflect.

Due to rounding, column percentages may not equal exactly $100 \%$.

## Demographic Items

## 1. How old are you?

For the Waynesboro students, the median age was 14 years, and the modal (most commonly answered) age was 13 years.

As seen in the chart below, ages reported logically correspond to grade levels. Five individuals appear to have mis-answered this item (the two high school students reporting an age of 12 or younger, and the 3 $7^{\text {th }}$ graders reporting an age of 18 years or older).However, these invalid responses yield a tolerable $1 \%$ error rate.

About $50 \%$ of students primarily live with both parents; the responses are quite consistent across grade levels.

The top responses were "Family," and "Friends and peers." When viewed across grade levels, certain trends are apparent. The influence of friends increases with grade level (a $9 \%$ increase from $7^{\text {th }}$ to $11^{\text {th }}$ ). This finding is consistent with those found in the 2006 and 2008 Youth Risk Behavior Surveys; see table below. However, a downward trend across grade levels in the influence of family was not observed for the 2010 sample, though such a trend is pronounced in the 2008 sample. School personnel, religious leaders, and media have little influence for any of the students.

## Safety

According to the Insurance Institute for Highway Safety (www.iihs.org/laws/HelmetUseCurrent.aspx), in the state of Virginia all motorcycle riders are required to wear a helmet, while there are no state laws regarding helmet use for bicycle, skateboard and scooter riders in the state of Virginia. However, the City of Waynesboro has an ordinance which requires children under age 14 to wear a helmet when riding within city limits.

A large number of motorcycle riders wore helmets all of the time, but the percentage of consistent helmet wearers ("Always wore a helmet") deceases as grade level increases. Approximately one-fifth of those who rode a motorcycle in the past year indicated they never wear a helmet.

When compared to helmet use with motorcycles, bicycle and scooter riders wore helmets less reliably. About $75 \%$ of respondents have ridden in the past year, but $2 / 3$ of those who did ride "never wore a helmet." Looking at results by grade level, $7^{\text {th }}$ graders "always wore a helmet" more than $11^{\text {th }}$ graders ( $12 \%$ vs. $4 \%$, respectively). This may be due in part to the City of Waynesboro's ordinance which requires students under age 14 to wear helmets.

Consistent helmet use ("Always wore a helmet") is lowest among skateboard users.

The nearly $50 \%$ response that seat belts are always worn is reassuring, but just over half of the respondents don't use their seat belt regularly. There is a nearly $20 \%$ difference in responses of "Always" when comparing $7^{\text {th }}$ and $9^{\text {th }}$ graders.

Seat belt use increased from the 2008 survey for $7^{\text {th }}$ and $9^{\text {th }}$ graders; $38 \%$ and $31 \%$, respectively, indicated in the 2008 administrations that they always wear a seat belt. Consistent usage stayed the same for $11^{\text {th }}$ graders.

In the 2010 data as well as the archival data presented below, it is evident that suicide attempts are slightly higher for $9^{\text {th }}$ graders than for other grade levels. Frequency of suicide attempts has decreased for $7^{\text {th }}$ graders over the past three survey administrations.

The results for all Waynesboro students are displayed in the following graph.


Note that for all substances, the lines are peaked at the number of students with first use at age 9 or younger (for all but marijuana, this is the highest peak overall). Note an increase in first age of tobacco use for age 12. Use of other drugs shows a slight spike at 12 and 15 years of age. First marijuana use goes up at 13 and 15 years old. The tapering of the lines downward with increased age is a function of fewer respondents being old enough to give those responses.

## Substance Use -- Past 30 days

The following 10 survey items all ask about substance use over the 30 days preceding the survey. Each item asks about a different drug: cigarettes, other tobacco, alcohol, marijuana, cocaine, huffing of aerosols or other gases, heroin, methamphetamines, steroids, and prescription/OTC drugs.

In general, usage goes up as grade level increases, with the exception of inhaled substances, which has the highest usage among $7^{\text {th }}$ graders.

When reviewing these numbers, the reader is encouraged to keep in mind that the 30 days preceding the survey would have included winter break, which may skew typical behavior.

This chart displays all 30 day use information. The numbers on the vertical axis represent absolute number of students using. Anybody who used in any amount during the 30 days preceding survey administration was counted in this total.

Alcohol use is highest within each grade, and increases the most as students get older. Marijuana use also appears to increase steadily with advance in grade levels. Note that prescription and OTC drug use as a means of getting high jumps from $7^{\text {th }}$ to $9^{\text {th }}$ grade, then appears to level off.

## Perceived Ease -- Substance Procurement

A slight increase in high school students who indicate that medical professionals have given this information suggests physicians are more likely to bring the topic up with high-schoolers.
